

SNACKTIME


I will provide snacks for students the first week of school.





- Play Phonics and Word Games (Keep things in the car!)
- Incorporate Learning into Life (chores, play, grocery store, billboards)
- Work on Fine Motor Activities & Handwriting (Writing Name) (Handout from Teacher Table)
- Allow students to engage in challenging activities to grow toward independence
- Practice Following Directions the first time (build to 3-step directions)
