Car Line Pick Up and Drop Off:

- Students should be dropped in the car line by 8:10 am so that we can have all students in class by 8:15 am.

Walk Ups:



- We only allow walk ups in the morning for Pre-K students and their siblings or parents who have an appointment with the school.
- All other students should come in through the car line or bus line.
- Afternoon walkup is available for all students, parents must have the car tag with them for walk ups as well.

Absences and Makeup Work



McKeel does not recognize excused absences.



- Absent 1-10 days: Parents should keep doctor/dental notes for their record only. No “excuse” not is necessary unless absences accumulated are 10 or less for the school year.
- Absent 10+ Days: After a student has accumulated more than 10 days of absences, tardies, early checkouts, admin may contact if excessive absences are without cause.



Attendance:



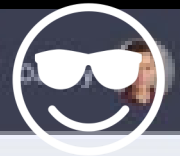
- Automatic Notifications: Parents will receive an automated email from Systems every 5 absences.
- Students must be present for half of the school day to be considered present.
- Email your child's teacher if you have an extended pre-planned absence (e.g., medical procedure or other important reasons).
- Excessive absences could result in attendance probation, and persistent attendance issues may lead to dismissal from McKeel Academy Central. Excessive absences, tardies, or early checkouts will be reviewed by administration to identify the causes and determine appropriate actions.

Attendance:

- Students are tardy after 8:15 and will need to get a tardy slip from the office.
- Parents should keep doctor/dental notes/excuses for their own records or can upload. See next screen for uploads.
- No Check outs allowed after 2:30 PM.

Student data is made accessible to our families online through McKeel Systems. Parents & guardians must be granted an account by the primary enrolling parent.



- **We will be using Canvas as our online platform for classwork assignments, activities, and formatives (quizzes).**
- **Summative's (tests) will be given on Canvas at the discretion of each teacher at the end of a unit.**
- **Students will have the opportunity to redo their summative (test) if they choose. They will have to submit a request to retake the test.**

- Parents will login through the student account.
- Each teacher uses Canvas in different ways. Please have your student show you each class and how they are using Canvas in class.
- Canvas is a great place to look for information or assignments. If your child is absent, has missing assignments, or needs additional information please have them look in Canvas on the agenda for each class.
- Please note that just because there is an assignment in Canvas doesn't mean there will be a grade in the gradebook.
- You can set parameters in canvas to receive notifications.

- **At Home Practice:** We do not give homework. Each class is different with assignments, so students may create their own homework if they don't do it in class as assigned.



Legging colors are solid white, black, or gray – no leg showing. Jeans must be plain and free of rips.

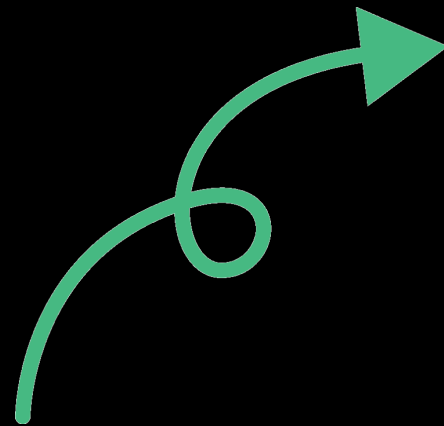


Uniform Reminder




Volunteers

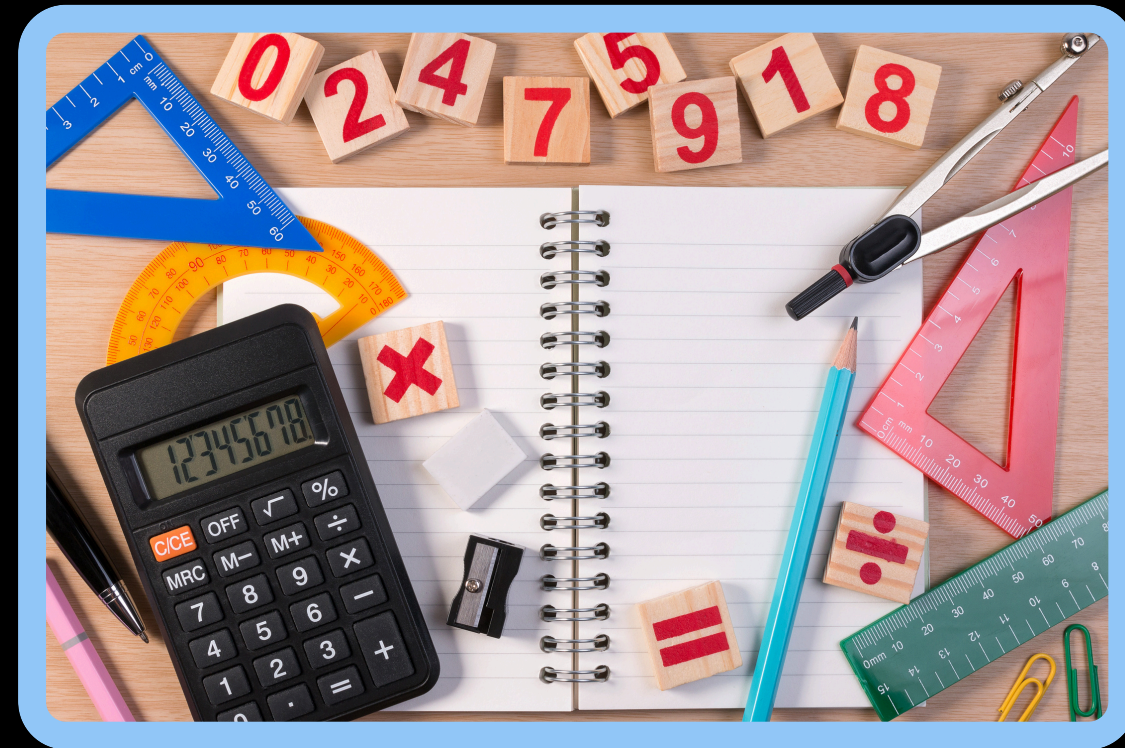
