Car Line Pick Up and Drop Off:

• Students should be dropped in the car line by 8:10 am so that we can have all students in class by 8:15 am.

Walk Ups:



We only allow walk ups in the morning for Pre-K students and their siblings or parents who have an appointment with the school.

• All other students should come in through the car line or bus line.

Afternoon walkup is available for all students, parents must have the car tag with them for walk ups as well.

Absences and Makeup Work McKeel does not recognize excused absences.

Absent I-IO days: Parents should keep doctor/dental notes for their record only. No "excuse" not is necessary unless absences accumulated are IO or less for the school year.

Absent 10+ Days: After a student has accumulated more than 10 days of absences, tardies, early checkouts, admin may contact if excessive absences are without cause.



- Automatic Notifications: Parents will receive an automated email from Systems every 5 absences.
- Students must be present for half of the school day to be considered present.
- Email your child's teacher if you have an extended pre-planned absence (e.g., medical procedure or other important reasons).
- Excessive absences could result in attendance probation, and persistent attendance issues may lead to dismissal from McKeel Academy Central. Excessive absences, tardies, or early checkouts will be reviewed by administration to identify the causes and determine appropriate actions.
