




Uploading Documentation for Absences

- Parents can submit documentation for absences by logging into McKeel Systems and selecting attendance. There is an option to "upload note".
- Attendance Warning (10 or more unexcused absences)
 After a student has accumulated 10 days of absences, tardies, or early checkouts the parent will receive an automated attendance message notifying them that their student has reached an excessive number of absences.


Attendance Contract \$\tilde{\psi}\$ (15 or more unexcused absences)

If a student reaches 15 unexcused absences, they will be placed on an attendance contract. A parent or guardian will be required to attend a meeting to review attendance expectations. The contract will remain in effect for the remainder of the school year. Students on an attendance contract may be unable to participate in extracurricular activities including field trips, field days and house days. Ongoing attendance issues may lead to dismissal from McKeel Academy Central.



MAKE UP WORK

Students are responsible for making up any missed work. Students in Grades 4-6 should check their Canvas account and communicate with all teachers regarding assignments.



MIDDLE SCHOOLATTENDANCE:

PARENTS WILL RECEIVE AN AUTOMATED EMAIL FROM SYSTEMS EVERY 5 ABSENCES.

- STUDENTS MUST BE PRESENT FOR HALF OF THE SCHOOL DAY TO BE CONSIDERED PRESENT.
- FOR MIDDLE SCHOOL, STUDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE A SET NUMBER OF "SEAT" HOURS. CHECKOUTS, TARDIES, AND ABSENCES WILL AFFECT THE NUMBER THE NUMBER OF SEAT HOURS.
- EMAIL YOUR CHILD'S TEACHER IF YOU HAVE AN EXTENDED PRE-PLANNED ABSENCE (E.G., MEDICAL PROCEDURE OR OTHER IMPORTANT REASONS).
- EXCESSIVE ABSENCES COULD RESULT IN ATTENDANCE PROBATION, AND PERSISTENT ATTENDANCE ISSUES MAY LEAD TO DISMISSAL FROM MCKEEL ACADEMY CENTRAL. EXCESSIVE ABSENCES, TARDIES, OR EARLY CHECKOUTS WILL BE REVIEWED BY ADMINISTRATION TO IDENTIFY THE CAUSES AND DETERMINE APPROPRIATE ACTIONS.


Attendance:

Supplies
